To reduce global warming and solve the problem of unbalanced global development, the United Nations in 2015 adopted 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), together with the three objectives of Economic Growth, Societal Improvement, and Environmental Sustainability. Its aim was to promote action to reach these goals.

Taiwan is a global citizen and always follows environmental protection. In 1987, the government established the Environmental Protection Administration, and non-government environmental sectors developed Plant Toxicology, Ecological Conservation, Recycling, Environmental Education and other initiatives. In 1990, Dharma Master Cheng Yen called on the public to "sort recyclables with your two clapping hands". She pioneered a new way of recycling. Taiwan people now practice an eco-friendly lifestyle and share environmental awareness through the mass media. Day by day, we put our words into action by living with a greener lifestyle.

Over the past 30 years, both government and non-governmental organizations have worked together to transform Taiwan, once called a "rubbish island", into a global role model for recycling. But the rise in global temperature and climate change have become an emergency. As the crisis





intensifies, environmental problems have become critical to the sustainable development of mankind. It is urgent for all of us to work hard together to resolve them.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the Environmental Protection Mission of Tzu Chi Foundation and also the 50th anniversary of Earth Day. For the 6th Tzu Chi Forum, we have with deep sincerity invited representatives from the government, academia and non-government organizations to review concepts of environmental protection; to share opinions for the future: and to establish a shared understanding and a consensus on our collective actions to achieve the sustainable development of Taiwan and the world.

About the Tzu Chi Forum

The Tzu Chi Forum is an international conference to introduce Tzu Chi's ideas, humanity, and culture to the academic community and religions worldwide. Every two to three years, the academic forum is held to present and study the Dharma Path of Tzu Chi.

In his book, the late Professor Peter B. Clarke, a professor of the Faculty of Theology at the University of Oxford, described Tzu Chi's spiritual principles in details, and highly praised the teachings of Dharma Master Cheng Yen as a representative of the Contemporary Buddhism. After learning about the book, Dr. Rey-Sheng Her, director of Department of Literature and History, Tzu Chi Foundation, contacted Professor Clarke.

Clarke believed globalization is happening in reverse and that Eastern cultures and religions are transforming the West and the world. Since Tzu Chi is engaged Buddhism, its stress on altruism is what religion should focus on. Thus, he suggested, Tzu Chi should host an academic forum to present itself to scholars worldwide so that they could study and learn about it.

The forums have been held since 2010, with participation by many well-known scholars from around the world. They have covered the universal values of environmental protection, Buddhism and charity, and management of charity organizations, to show the profundity and breadth of Buddhism and Tzu Chi.
